Dear Mr. Fusarelli,

On behalf of the Arlington Chamber of Commerce, I wish to express our strong support for the GLUP amendment change for the Melwood property at 750 South 23<sup>rd</sup> Street.

Melwood's request to change the GLUP designation of their property from "Public" to "Low-Medium Residential" is part of their proposal to transform their existing workforce development center into a mixed-use space. As noted in the Draft Study document, the new facility will house Melwood's workforce development services and programs on the ground floor, while the upper floors would include more than 100 affordable housing units. More than one-third of these affordable units would be set aside for people with disabilities.

Arlington and Northern Virginia at large are facing a shortage of affordable housing for our residents. Finding an affordable place to live independently in the Northern Virginia region is already difficult, and the barriers are greater for people with disabilities. This project would help alleviate the shortage of affordable housing, and further the goal of the Livability 22202 Action Plan of providing "a balanced diversity of housing types, from single family homes to townhouses, condominiums, and apartments."

Melwood is a longstanding member of the Arlington community, and this project will positively impact the Aurora Highlands neighborhood, where Melwood has had a presence for many years. We are encouraged that the redevelopment of this property will provide affordable housing for some of most vulnerable residents, while maintaining a commitment to Melwood's existing on-site workforce development programs and additional services.

We encourage the County to approve the Draft Study Document in a timely manner, and proceed to consideration and adoption of the GLUP amendment by the Planning Commission and the County Board.
