Introduction

- Background: The County Board allocated \$2.0 million in one-time funding in FY 2025 to support multiyear pilots of after-school programs both at schools and in the community.
- NOFA Purpose: To support middle and/or high school youth by implementing a two-year pilot offering after-school programming at one or more sites.
- Funding: \$550,000 in one-time funding from Arlington County Government


Location

- Arlington Mill Community Center
 - 2 classrooms with the capacity for 25 youth in each
- Secondary school meeting the community eligibility standard for free and reduced lunch (e.g., Kenmore Middle School, Wakefield High School)
 - County and APS staff will work with grantee to secure space designated for the program. Grantee is required to sign any facility use agreement between grantee and appropriate party.
- Proposals should consider the capacity and limitations of the space being proposed



Timeline

- FAQs posted soon after this meeting and as they come in
- NOFA proposals due: Sunday, August 17, at 11:59 p.m. through the County's Submittable portal
- Award approval: October 2025 (tentative)
- Grant period will be two years, covering the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 school years

Evaluation Process

- Proposals will be evaluated by a review panel consisting of representatives from various Arlington County Government departments and Arlington Public Schools
- Reviewers will independently rate each proposal using the rubric included at the end of the application
- Independent scores will be used as the basis for discussion and award recommendations from the review panel

If awarded...

- Documented safety/security procedures, insurance, and space use agreement required
- Must sign grant agreement
- Must sign space use agreement
- Must be up to date on County business license taxes, if applicable
- Anticipated start in late fall/winter of 2025
- Funding disbursed upfront on a semester basis
- Regular programmatic and financial reporting, including a site visit each semester
