## SUMMARY OF AGENDA ITEMS

## Approval of Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Roy moved approval of the January 29 and April 2 meeting minutes. Commissioner Greenwood seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 5-0.

## *Review Presentations on Research of Best Practices of Joint Use in Other Jurisdictions, ACG Demographic Update, and APS Fall 2024 10-Year Enrollment Projections*

Chair Snyder highlighted information from the research of best practices of joint use in other jurisdictions conducted by JFAC members, the demographic update provided by ACG staff, and the APS fall 10-Year enrollment projections provided by APS staff to lead a discussion among commissioners and prepare a draft letter to the County Board and School Board to review at the May 28 meeting.

Discuss and Gather Feedback on Presentations on Research of Best Practices of Joint Use in Other Jurisdictions, ACG Demographic Update, and APS Fall 2024 10-Year Enrollment Projections Commissioners discussed master planning for public facilities, considering underused existing APS and ACG buildings, Arlington's growing senior population, increasing awareness of County offerings, building in flexibility/adaptability, incentivizing affordable homeownership opportunities, improving joint-use agreements, an improved online reservation system across APS and ACG properties, incorporating preschool and/or daycare into more spaces, health services in schools, a County-wide needs analysis, public-private-partnerships, tapping into vacant office space, and program capacity compared to traditional design capacity. They also expressed a desire to conduct more research on streamlined pilot programs and examples of repurposing buildings for joint use.
