### Neighborhood Complete Streets Program

Addressing safety and access problems on neighborhood streets



- Replaced Neighborhood Traffic Calming Committee (NTCC)
- 12-14 member Commission, appointed by the Arlington County Board including representatives from:
  - Pedestrian Advisory Committee (PAC)
  - Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC)
  - Transportation Commission (TC)
  - Neighborhood Conservation (NCAC), now Arlington Neighborhoods Program
  - At-Large members
- Limited to three 3-year terms (total 9 years)
- Meet quarterly + additional meetings for Funding Hearings and as needed

- Provides advice and input to the County Board and County Staff with respect to developing the NCS Program processes to be adopted by the County Board, including project selection criteria, project prioritization, public outreach to encourage engagement, and public traffic safety education.
- Provides advice to County Staff in connection with implementing the NCS Program processes approved by the Board, including calls for new projects, and ongoing advice regarding developing and implementing NCS projects.
- Participates with County Staff in administrating the ranking system used by the NCS program to prioritize potential neighborhood complete streets projects.
- Makes funding recommendations to the County Board regarding proposed NCS Projects.
- Participates with County Staff in developing *neighborhood traffic safety education* programs.
- Recommends new policies and strategies to the County Board based on NCS Program experience and evolving best practices in other jurisdictions. Advises the Board on Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) priorities and on other relevant policies

# NCSC Annual Workplan

#### Fall Meeting (September, In Person)

- Organizational meeting to chart the year
- Plan / discuss any advocacy needs or meetings that need to be scheduled (with County Board members or others)
- Review schedule of upcoming meetings and decide which to target for all remote meetings, decide on any sub-committees, roles and responsibilities etc.
- Winter Meeting (December 5<sup>th</sup> In person/hybrid optional)
  - Staff provide an updated list, with a group of suggested projects for further scoping (sounds like there's an interest in preliminary scoping of more than we can approve, to have some insurance)
  - Commissioners volunteer to support public engagement / take the lead on keeping an eye on specific projects
  - Debrief on advocacy meetings or conversations; action on letter(s) to the Board, etc. if necessary

# **NCSC Annual Workplan**

#### Late Winter (February, Online)

- Status update on project engagement and design etc.
- Educational presentation on relevant issues from staff

#### Spring Meeting (May, In Person/Hybrid)

 Stand-alone meeting to be tentatively scheduled later in the spring and could be an "extra" meeting beyond the regular quarterly working meetings. Would also allow Commission to separate out project approval/recommendation/endorsement from policy and budget advocacy roles

#### Funding Hearing (June 12<sup>th,</sup> TBD location/format)

- Early summer meeting focused on after action and analysis from previous projects, follow up from Board approval of recent projects, any fall out etc.
- Discuss proposed CIP and any advocacy/engagement needed from the Commission
