SUMMARY OF PRESENTATIONS/DISCUSSIONS

Chair's Introduction and Review/Approval of Meeting Minutes

- Commission consideration of the September 19 minutes.
- The minutes were adopted as prepared with no objections.

Public Comment

^{*} Park and Recreation Commission public comment is open to all with a 3-minute limit per person.

Public Commenter #1: Jean Henceroth (of the Leeway Overlee Civic Association), spoke on the
draft Langston Boulevard Area Plan and specifically the former Lee Community Center. Ms.
Henceroth asked that the County conduct a short- and long-term evaluation of the community
center and its associated park. There is a need for art studio and other community-centered
amenities within this part of the County. Destruction of native tree canopy and other green
space is an issue for this area.

Forestry and Natural Resources Plan (FNRP) Update (Follow-Up Presentation and Discussion)

Ryan Delaney, DPR provided an update on the FNRP efforts and the current process to date. Mr. Delaney also explained edits to the current draft of the FNRP guided by community discussion and engagement (this also included refined strategic directions).

The PRC discussion included increased metrics for the implementations proposed and deer management plan overlap. Mr. Delaney will check in with the project manager for the deer management plan effort to find out more about how this effort relates with the recommendations proposed within the draft FNRP.

Plan Langston Boulevard Follow-Up Discussion

Natasha Alfonso-Ahmed, CPHD provided a follow-up presentation and discussion on the Plan Langston Boulevard efforts and the current process to date. Ms. Alfonso-Ahmed further explained the various frameworks including but not limited to future land use, building form and height, public spaces, among others. The presentation also detailed which proposed policies were removed, including implementation recommendations for those policies still on the draft plan.

The PRC discussion included the proposed tree canopy goal (35%) and how that may be in conflict with what is being proposed in the draft FNRP Countywide (40%). Ms. Alfonso-Ahmed discussed the importance of accomplishing 40% for the majority of the sites but also review how these goals may be tiered based on the parcel sizes. Ms. Irena Lazic, DPR, added the similarities with the tools that were provided within the Pentagon City Sector Plan (PCSP) which also functioned as part of a tiered approach (where more plantable spaces are possible). Increased density proposed means that there may be a need for additional athletic facilities. Ms. Alfonso-Ahmed detailed that the analysis of additional athletic facilities may need to be explored further as part of a future planning process associated with the Langston Boulevard corridor area. This may include repurposing or rethinking of existing site as well. There is also the need for additional parcels needed for affordable housing opportunities. Lee Center changes and envisioning how that space may be used is supported by the PLB (for public space purposes and others, but the timing for when that will be explored may need to be discussed further by the County Board.

Removing certain planning districts within Housing Conservation District (HCD) areas within the PLB planning district. The issue of active, public space amenities not being planned for clearly within the plan and this needs to be prioritized within the proposed plan. This cannot be addressed with Publicly Owned Private Spaces (POPS). Conversion of POPS as more active amenities. Ms. Lazic detailed that site plan/master planning development processes will determine what amenities are proposed for any planned, public space area. For any site plan development in the future, they need to be planned closely

with the PRC and the community to assess the various amenities (including those recommendations within the Public Spaces Master Plan (PSMP)).

PRC Vice Chair Barker spoke about the Gulf Branch Stream Restoration effort and a walk-around
meeting that will occur tomorrow evening, including any issues that have been raised. There is a
potential sewer issue with this area. Also, the change from "restoration" to "revitalization"
effort may have significant environmental impacts. Commissioner Sanders detailed some of the
issues related to stormwater management that may be associated with this effort.
