


Current Status of the "Viewsheds" Project in the GW Memorial Parkway

- In early October, the NPS removed over 300 trees, without notice and without proper Environmental Assessments, from the forest between the Potomac River and the roadway of the GWMP, north of Spout Run
- The purpose of the removal was to restore "historic" views of the river from the Parkway
- Once the alarm was raised and input was provided to the Superintendent of the GWMP, the project was halted. 300 additional trees were spared, at least temporarily
- The NPS committed to a process ahead which will involve the opportunity for public feedback; the process has not been defined
- Ongoing public pressure is needed before, during, and after the hearing. A "coordinating group" of concerned citizens is being formed.
- The purpose of this discussion is to establish next steps that the Commission can consider

View 1: Before-After Photos Prove Tree Removal Has NOT Been Selective. Mature, Native Forest Clearcut.









