The Park and Recreation Commission ("PRC") commends the County Board for publishing and requesting public comment on a draft Climate Action Resolution dated January 28, 2025.

We are pleased that the Community Energy Plan will be revised, but its role should be one of many elements of a comprehensive Climate Action Plan. A comprehensive Climate Action Plan should include factors in addition to carbon emissions, such as natural resources, that contribute to climate change and resilience. Carbon emissions are critically

important in addressing climate change, but a comprehensive Climate Action Plan should specify the importance of natural resources on both our public and private lands in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and mitigating climate change impacts.

We are pleased that our long-standing request for increased collaboration on climate issues among County departments as part of the proposal at Paragraph 11 but recommend that this paragraph be elevated to the top priority for the proposed Climate Action Plan.
