These trees meet or exceed the following qualifications, and were recommended for approval by the subcommittee


- Size (within 10% of largest current notable tree, or, if the species is not on the list, greater than 30 inches for large canopy trees, and greater than 10 inches for small canopy trees)
- Neighborhood value
- Unique species






3800 24th St N – Two *Cedrus deodora*







3800 24th St N – Magnolia Kobus (County Champion)




