Check Your Family's Measles Vaccine Status Bèfore Travel

For travel in the U.S.

(Domestic Travel)

- Young children should get two doses of the measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine (MMR).
 - Get dose 1 between 12 and 15 months old.
 - Get dose 2 between 4 and 6 years old.
- Teens and adults without evidence of immunity* should get one MMR dose.

For travel outside of the U.S.

(International Travel)

- Babies 6 to 11 months old should get one MMR dose.
 - Babies who get one MMR dose before their first birthday should get two more doses: one between 12 and 15 months old, and another at least 28 days later.
- Children 12 months and older should get two MMR doses, at least 28 days apart.
- Teens and adults without evidence of immunity* should get two MMR doses, at least 28 days apart.



^{*} Evidence of immunity includes a record of measles vaccination or proof of a past measles infection. Check with your health care provider to confirm your immunity.
