

MARSH FERN

Common Name	Scientific Name	Description	Light Req.	Soil & moisture	Bloom time
Yarrow	<i>Achillea millefolium</i>	A fragrant plant in the aster family with lacy, fern-like leaves and flat-topped white flower clusters that attract native bees.	S-PS	Dry	Apr-Sep
Pussytoes	<i>Antennaria plantaginifolia</i>	A low-growing perennial with fuzzy flower heads resembling a cat's paw; attracts native bees.	S-PS	Dry	Mar-Jun
Bluestar	<i>Amsonia tabernaemntana</i>	Clump-forming perennial with narrow, willow-like leaves and blue, star-shaped flowers; attracts butterflies and pollinators.	S-PS	Moist Loam	May
Swamp Milkweed	<i>Asclepias incarnata</i>	Tall perennial with bright pink blooms; thrives in wet soils. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and is vital for Monarch caterpillars.	S-PS	Moist/Wet Clay, Loam	May-Jun
Columbine	<i>Aquilegia canadensis</i>	A perennial in the buttercup family with red and yellow flowers; rapidly self-seeds.	S-PS	Dry/Moist Loam	Apr-Jul
Green-and-Gold	<i>Chrysogonum virginicum</i>	Low-growing perennial, ideal as groundcover or edging, with small yellow daisy-like blooms.	S-PS-SH	Dry/Moist Loam	Mar-Jun
Coral Bells	<i>Heuchera americana</i>	A perennial with tall, hairy stems and small, pale flowers; used as groundcover or for foliage.	PS-SH	Dry/Moist Loam,Sandy	Apr-Jun
Virginia Bluebell	<i>Mertensia virginica</i>	Clusters of bell-shaped flowers, ranging from pink to purple depending on soil acidity.	PS-SH	Moist/Wet Clay,Loam	Mar-Jun
Jacob's Ladder	<i>Polemonium reptans</i>	Light blue, bell-shaped flowers in loose clusters; attracts bumblebees and Jacob's Ladder miner bee.	PS-SH	Moist	Apr-May
Wild Blue Phlox	<i>Phlox divaricata</i>	Fragrant clusters of pink or violet flowers that attract butterflies like swallowtails.	PS-SH	Moist Clay, Loam, Sand	Apr-Jun
FirePink	<i>Silene virginica</i>	A perennial with sticky stems and scarlet red flowers that attract hummingbirds and butterflies.	S-PS	Dry/Moist Loam	Apr-Jul
Foam Flower	<i>Tiarella cordifolia</i>	Slender stamens give foamflower spikes of star-shaped white blooms, creating a frothy look above lobed leaves.	S-PS-SH	Moist Loam	Apr-Jul
Golden Alexanders	<i>Zizia aurea</i>	Clusters of small yellow flowers, perfect for pollinator gardens and host to Black Swallowtail caterpillars.	S-PS-SH	Dry/Moist Clay, Loam, Sand	Apr-Jun
Rosemallow	<i>Hibiscus moscheutos</i>	Shrubby perennial with large saucer-shaped flowers; attracts many pollinators and provides nesting for native bees in hollow stems.	S-PS	Moist/Wet Clay, Loam	Jul-Sep
Purple Love Grass	<i>Eragrostis spectabilis</i>	Perennial ornamental grass with vibrant pink and purple seed heads in summer; attracts native songbirds.	S	Moist Clay, Loam, Sand	Aug-Oct
Rosy Sedge	<i>Carex rosea</i>	Semi-evergreen sedge with deep green, curled-tip leaves; excellent dry, shady groundcover and deer resistant.	PS-SH	Dry/Moist	Apr-May
Goldies Fern	<i>Dryopteris goldiana</i>	Large woodland fern with golden-yellow tips that blend into rich green.	PS-SH	Moist Humus	N/A
Maidenhair Fern	<i>Adiantum pedatum</i>	Delicate fern with fan-shaped fronds; red fiddleheads in spring. Provides shelter for small wildlife.	PS-SH	Moist	N/A
Marsh Fern	<i>Thelypteris palustris</i>	An attractive light green fern that is a host for the Marsh Fern Moth larva.	S-PS	Moist/Wet	N/A
Coral Honeysuckle	<i>Lonicera sempervirens</i>	A vine with long red bell-shaped flowers that attract hummingbirds, pollinators, and songbirds.	S-PS	Dry/Moist Clay, Loam, Sand	Apr-Oct
