| Summary | Many commenters do not support a new park entrance at 16th St. S. and S. Quincy St. They want to preserve the open space currently being used for recreational activities from sports to picnics. They noted that adding the paved path would prevent these activities from taking place. | Several respondents recommended improvements to the existing mid-block entrance on S. Quincy St. Ideas included re-grading, eliminating the steps, and adding a ramp. They noted that this would make the entrance ADA accessible and stroller- and bike-friendly, while not disrupting recreational use by creating a new entrance. | Several respondents asked if there was an option to keep the mid-block entrance on S. Quincy St. in addition to creating the new entrance at 16th St. S. and S. Quincy St. Two people noted the mid- block entrance is convenient for people who live south of the park. |

A few noted this was especially important since renovations to the picnic area will encourage more people to come for meals and celebrations. Several people also commented on the need to update the play area. (Note: This will be part of the Phase 2 renovations). | Some people expressed support for unpaved areas. Many of them were in favor of keeping the park as natural as possible. Two people commented that paved paths would encourage biking which could be disruptive and dangerous for pedestrians. |
