PATROL ACTIVITIES

- Officers conducted foot patrols in the Town Square, engaging with community members.
- ✓ While conducting area checks, officers introduced themselves to children sledding and had conversations with community members.
- ✓ Continued Introductions of ACPD personnel to employees of the Lucky Seven, Hotel Pentagon and The Comfort Inn.
- ✓ While placing a Traffic Classifier in the 2200 block of Kenmore Street South; officers met with community members, who indicated vehicles obey the speed limit, however expressed speed concerns of public transportation vehicles.

Traffic Classifiers provide a safe method for analyzing traffic patterns. The Data Collector employs side-fire radar to measure vehicle speed and length. Completely nonintrusive, it uses no wires, loops or hoses. This is an automated analytic graphing application that interprets traffic data.

Opportunities for February 2024

- ✓ Continued foot patrols inside The Shelton and Macedonia Apartments.
- ✓ Continued engagement with Stakeholders and other County Partners.
- ✓ Analyze traffic data gained from Traffic Classifier.

TRANSPORTATION SAFETY

Ensuring the safety of all travelers while maintaining the safe and orderly flow of traffic is a top priority of the Department.

- ✓ Officers contacted community members about parking violations and education on Department of Motor Vehicle laws.
- ✓ Officers checked Bike Share locations in the area.
- ✓ Officers monitored vehicle traffic on South Four Mile Run Drive.
- ✓ Officers observed school bus drop off at 22nd Street South, South Lincoln Street, and other crosswalks around Drew Elementary School.



Shots Heard
