I support a public conversation about future initiatives to include establishing a County Board-Directed Commission. This commission may be composed of diverse stakeholders (Community, Non-Profit, Faith-Based, Business, etc.,) should review and thoroughly analyze our government structure, and make recommendation(s) if it remains suitable for a population of over 240,000. The adaptive reuse initiative approved in 2024 converting outdated office buildings into multi-use spaces is a promising step. I will continue addressing commercial vacancies and fostering economic growth along Columbia Pike and Langston Boulevard.

Environmental Stewardship: A Lasting Legacy

Ensuring the Tree Canopy Program has the funding it needs to meet our Tree Canopy goals is non-negotiable to me. Trees are vital to our ecosystem, climate resilience, and sustainability efforts. Preserving and expanding green spaces must remain a top priority.
